# SAVANNAH RIVER BAPTIST ASSOCIATION HISTORICAL REPORT 2021-2022

In the twenty-second year of the 21st century, and the 220<sup>th</sup> year of the Savannah River Baptist Association we are going about our Father's business. The Okatee Baptist Church hosted the Annual Worship Celebration Sunday October 24, 2021. Rev. Allen Perry moderated the meeting and Rev. Jeff Cranston of the Lowcountry Community Church delivered message. Annual Reports gave the status of the SRBA and a light meal was served after the meeting.

The association collected 600 Christmas Packets for Prisoners this year and 189 Christmas Backpacks for Appalachia needy children. The Season of Prayer for International Missions and the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering was November 28 - December 5, 2021.

The Savannah River Baptist Association 1<sup>st</sup> Annual WMU Cookie Walk took place at Okatee Baptist Church December 4, 2021.

The Week of Prayer for North American Missions and the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering was March 7-14.

The Clarence and Christine Hanshew Offering for Associational Missions was June through August with a goal of \$15,000. The offering collected so far this year is \$6,566.46.

The association began collecting Migrant Ministry Kits for the migrant workers in the area. The churches collected 375 kits. This is the 53<sup>rd</sup> Anniversary of Migrant Missions in the association.

The Senior Adult Celebration was held August 11 at Port Royal Baptist Church. After postponing for 2 years there was a good turnout with much food and fellowship.

The Week of Prayer for State Missions and the Janie Chapman Offering was September 12-19.

The association decided to participate in the PIVOT process to discover God's will and purpose for the association. This process strengthens the spiritual health of the association so it can be passed on to help churches achieve spiritual health. Joe Youngblood is the consultant for this project.

Our Director of Missions Woody Oliver has been the supply pastor at Okatee Baptist Church for this past year. He decided to accept the full-time position as Pastor of Okatee Baptist and step down from his position as full time DOM to a part-time position during a transitional period. It was accepted by the Executive Committee at the August 2021 meeting with salary and benefits being adjusted accordingly. The association hired Scott Shields in August 2022 to be the interim DOM until a full time DOM can be hired.

Our community still finds itself plagued by the Covid-19 pandemic. The virus continues to be deadly worldwide making a second surge claiming more lives this year. The association has adjusted while churches have resumed in person services at this time.


# St. Helena Baptist Church

# Interim Associational Missions Strategist Report



Thank you for letting me come along side you for this season of transition in the Savannah River Baptist Association of Churches. My efforts since July have been to get pastors connected and begin bringing the vision frame plans shown above to life so that we can assist, resource, and equip healthy pastors, strengthen SRBA churches, and develop a multiply movement that begins in the low country.

After meeting with the SCBA leadership we are beginning to bring Pastors, staff, or lay leadership together in learning and collaborative cohorts on a consistent basis. These will strengthen relationships, build cooperation, and focus our mission together. "EQUIP" has been established as a quarterly leadership training opportunity to address and bring resources to key areas of local church ministry like evangelism, discipleship, and community impact. #### **BYLAWS**

# **Savannah River Baptist Association**

Adopted October 18, 2011 Amended October 23, 2012

#### **Preamble**

For the declaration of its fundamental purposes and doctrines and the guidance and control of its activities, Southern Baptist churches in Beaufort and Jasper Counties and adjacent communities propose to maintain a Baptist Association in conformity to these Bylaws subject to amendment:

#### ARTICLE I - Name

The name of this body shall be Savannah River Baptist Association.

# **ARTICLE II - Purpose**

This Association of Baptist churches exists to work together under God to implement the Great Commandment and the Great Commission of the Lord Jesus Christ in the power of the Holy Spirit (see Mark 12:28-31; Matthew 28:18-20; Acts 1:8; et al).

To pursue this purpose, the Association will seek to encourage and strengthen its churches; to start new churches; and to promote and engage in evangelism, missions and ministries locally and globally, especially as fostered by the South Carolina Baptist Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention.

In fulfillment of this purpose, the autonomy of local churches shall be fully respected.

### ARTICLE III - Statement of Faith

This Association affirms the autonomy of local Baptist churches to determine and conduct their life and work for the glory of God and the advancement of His Kingdom under the Lordship of Jesus Christ, through the leadership and power of the Holy Spirit, according to the authority of the Holy Bible, exercising the priesthood of believers. In any of its versions, the tenets of *The Baptist Faith and Message* adopted by the Southern Baptist Convention reflects in general acceptable doctrinal statements for member churches. Any doctrines inconsistent with or contradictory to the Holy Bible are not acceptable to this body.

## **ARTICLE IV – Membership**

**Section 1 – Composition:** The Association is composed of Baptist churches admitted into membership under the guidelines applicable at the time of admission.

### **Section 2. Definition of Terms:**

For purposes of clarity in these Bylaws and related referenced documents, the following definitions apply:

- **1**. **Member Church:** An established Baptist church having been admitted into membership by the Association under guidelines applicable at the time of admission.
- **2. Affiliated Churches** (includes affiliated Missions, Church Plants, and Watchcare churches):
- **A. Mission/Church Plant:** A congregation started and/or sponsored by a member church, or started through the partnership principle described in the Association's Church Planting Strategy Policy (see Article X). At inception, these congregations declare intent to apply for admission into the Association at the appropriate time.
- **B. Watchcare church:** A church having applied for membership in the Association, in process of becoming a member church, and having been declared under watchcare by the Missions Development Council.

# Section 3 - Privileges of Membership:

- 1. Members of Member Churches may enjoy full privileges, including holding office, voting and/or participating in decision-making processes of the Association.
- 2. Members of non-member churches (Affiliated Churches) may enjoy privileges of attending Associational Meetings, events, and functions absent the privileges of holding office, voting and/or participating in the decision-making processes of the Association.

# Section 4 — Membership of New Churches

A Baptist church or mission/church plant that desires membership in the Savannah River Baptist Association (Association) shall follow the process outlined below. These guidelines direct a church applying for admission through a timely process that allows the Applicant Church (Applicant) and Association to understand each other more fully, to gain better appreciation of each other's call to Kingdom service, and to identify a compatibility of call and cooperation.

# Step 1: Church Applies for Admission

The Applicant secures an information packet from Association Office and studies packet materials. Applicant completes and returns to the Association Office the Membership Application form and other materials requested in the packet. The Missions Development Council (Council), after receiving and reviewing the materials, sets a meeting of the Applicant and Council to examine together the request and to explain the process and requirements for membership.

# Step 2: Applicant and Council meet, at Applicant site if possible.

The Council explains vitals of the Association and answers Applicant's questions concerning these matters. Council examines vitals of Applicant; Applicant answers Council's questions concerning these matters. Applicant provides requested information either orally, in writing, or both.

If the examination is satisfactory, Council requests *Confirmation of Membership Application*. Confirmation may be provided at the meeting or within 15 days. If Applicant confirms application, proceed to Step 3. If Applicant withdraws application, the file is closed.

### **Step 3: Council Declares Applicant Under Watchcare**

The Council promptly notifies the Applicant in writing of its watchcare status, and notifies the Executive Board (Board) at its next meeting. Council begins a watchcare ministry to Applicant for a minimum of six (6) months.

If the Applicant is an Affiliated Mission/Church Plant, the Council may choose to accept the time spent under the supervision of the sponsor church or Association in lieu of a watchcare period and move to step 4 with the Membership Application.

### Step 4: Council Recommends Admission to Membership

At the end of a satisfactory six (6) months watchcare period, the Council shall recommend admission of the Applicant into membership at the next Executive Board meeting or the Annual Meeting, whichever comes first.

If the six (6) months watchcare period is not completed satisfactorily, the Council shall suggest necessary adjustments to the Applicant and extend the watchcare period for an additional three (3) to six (6) months to provide time for the Applicant to make said adjustments. At the end of this period, the Council will report the status of the application to the Executive Board.

Upon two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Executive Board members present and voting or two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Annual Meeting messengers present and voting, the Applicant Church is received into membership and enjoys all the privileges and responsibilities granted it by the Association's Bylaws.

#### Section 5 -- Withdrawal and Dismissal

- 1. Member churches may withdraw from the Association as they desire by notifying the clerk in writing.
- 2. This Association shall not maintain fellowship with any church that neglects to demonstrate a spirit of cooperation with the Association, to support the causes fostered by the Association, to contribute financially to the budget of the Association; or that

departs from the principles of the Christian Faith as taught in the Bible and declared in the Statement of Faith in Article III of these Bylaws.

3. Any complaint by a member church against any member church or affiliated church shall be brought in writing to the Executive Board. The Moderator shall then appoint a committee from the Executive Board to make a careful study of the situation, and if findings justify, this Committee shall seek reconciliation or satisfaction of the bodies concerned. When such reconciliation or satisfaction cannot be obtained, the Executive Board shall bring its reports and recommendation to the next Annual Meeting of the Association. Withdrawal of fellowship from any church shall require a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the messengers present and voting.

## **Section 6-- Non- Supporting Churches**

When churches fail to support the work of the Association, a committee appointed by the moderator shall consult with said church as to their desire and intent to continue in fellowship.

### ARTICLE V - Officers

The officers of this Association shall be the Director of Missions, Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Treasurer, Clerk and Historian. Only members of member churches may serve as officers of this Association. The election and duties of these officers are delineated in the following Sections of this Article.

### Section 1. Election.

The officers of this Association, except the Director of Missions, shall be elected by the Association at the Annual Meeting for a one year term to begin upon adjournment of the Annual Meeting at which they are elected, except the Clerk whose term shall begin the first day of January following election. They shall be nominated by the Nominating Committee. Additional nominations may be made from the floor. The Moderator and Vice-Moderator shall not be elected to more than two (2) consecutive full terms.

#### Section 2. Moderator.

The Moderator shall be the presiding officer of the Association and its Executive Board. The Moderator shall appoint all special committees needed to carry out the work of the Association, with the exception of a Director of Missions Search Committee. The Moderator shall serve as ex-officio member of all committees. The Moderator shall also serve as principal officer and trustee of the corporation.

#### Section 3. Vice Moderator.

The Vice-Moderator shall preside in the absence or upon the request of the Moderator. The Vice-Moderator shall assist the Moderator in carrying out the duties of the Moderator in the best interest of the Association. The Vice-Moderator shall accede to

the office of Moderator should that office become vacant, in which case the Nominating Committee shall nominate to the Executive Board or to the Annual Meeting a new Vice-Moderator. The Vice-Moderator shall also serve as an officer and trustee of the corporation.

#### Section 4. Treasurer.

The Treasurer shall administer the receipt and disbursement of all funds sent to or raised by the Association, in compliance with the approved policies of the Association. The Treasurer shall maintain accurate records of all receipts and disbursements and shall prepare written quarterly reports for the Executive Board and for publication to the churches. The Treasurer shall also serve as an officer and trustee of the corporation. The Association shall elect an Assistant Treasurer to fulfill the duties of the Treasurer in his/her absence.

#### Section 5. Trustees.

- 1. The Trustees shall be composed of the Moderator (who shall serve as Chair), Vice-Moderator, and Treasurer.
- 2. The Trustees shall serve as the legal representatives of the Association. They shall hold in trust title(s) to all Association properties, except for cash or invested funds. Neither shall their signatures be required for transactions such as maintenance / service contracts, purchase or lease agreements on office equipment, etc.
- 3. The Trustees shall convey and/or receive title to property when so instructed by the Executive Board or by the Association in session.
- 4. The Trustees, with the help of the Administrative Assistant, shall maintain all legal documents in a safety deposit box, with copies on file in the Association office for ready reference.
- 5. In all matters pertaining to the discharge of their duties, the Trustees shall act only upon authorization by the Executive Board or by the Association in session.

#### Section 6. Clerk.

The Clerk shall keep an accurate record of the proceedings of the Association and the Executive Board. The Clerk shall mail the Annual Church Profile forms to the church clerks, and present to the Annual Meeting a digest of the profiles. The Clerk shall prepare and publish the Annual of the Association including therein reports from the sessions, statistics pertaining to the churches, and historical material as may be of permanent value. The Association shall elect an Assistant Clerk to fulfill the duties of the Clerk in his/her absence. The term for both shall be January 1 through December 31.

#### Section 7. Historian.

The Historian shall compile all matters of historical value regarding the Association for inclusion in the Annual, and shall provide for the custody of all items of historical significance.

### Section 8. Director of Missions.

### 1. Principal Function.

The Director of Missions shall lead the Association to accomplish its mission within the guidelines of the current job description as recommended by the Personnel Advisory Committee and approved by the Executive Board.

### 2. Call and Compensation.

The Director of Missions shall be called for an indefinite period of time by the Executive Board upon recommendation of a Director of Missions Search Committee. His Compensation, Protection Benefits, Reimbursable Expenses, and Leave Time shall be as set forth in the approved budget of the Association and/or employee policies.

### 3. Accountability.

The Director of Missions is responsible to the Executive Board for the discharge of his duties, and is directly accountable to the Personnel Advisory Committee.

### 4. Reports.

The Director of Missions shall make a quarterly report of the life and work of the Association to the Executive Board, and annually to the Association in session.

### 5. Relationship to Committees.

The Director of Missions shall serve as *ex officio* member of all committees, boards, councils and teams. He shall serve as chairman of the Associational Council.

### 6. Relationship to Staff.

The Director of Missions shall directly supervise all employed staff, except as may be otherwise assigned.

# ARTICLE VI – Meetings

# Section 1 - Messengers

- 1. Member churches shall be entitled to two (2) messengers and one additional messenger for each additional fifty (50) resident members or fraction thereof above that first fifty, provided that no church shall be entitled to more than fifteen (15) messengers and provided they are elected by the church in which they hold membership.
- 2. The Director of Missions and the officers of the Association shall be messengers to the Association by virtue of the office held and shall not be counted against the quota of the churches of which they are members.
- 3. Elected messengers shall be certified on the Annual Church Profile to be submitted to the Association at the beginning of the church year and shall serve for the ensuing associational year. In the event a messenger is unable to complete a term, the church shall elect a replacement and notify the Association Office in writing.

### Section 2 - Annual Meeting

The date of the Annual Meeting of the Association shall be on the first Tuesday following the third Sunday in October. If at any time it becomes necessary to change the place or time, the Executive Board shall be empowered to do so.

### Section 3 – Special Meetings

Special meetings of the Association shall be called by the Moderator for urgent reason or upon request of a standing or special committee, provided (1) a notice of one week has been given, and (2) the purpose, time, and place of the meeting is stated in the notice.

### Section 4 – Quorum

For Annual Meeting, messengers present shall constitute a quorum. For Special Meetings, messengers from one-third (1/3) of member churches shall constitute a quorum.

#### Section 5 – Associational Year

The associational year shall extend from October 1 through September 30.

#### Section 6 - Fiscal Year

The fiscal year for the Association shall be January 1 through December 31.

# Section 7 - Annual Report

Each church in the Association shall bear the responsibility of reporting annually to the Association the condition of the church by completing the Annual Church Profile (ACP), a form provided by the Association. This report is due in the Association Office not later than the second Monday in October.

# Section 8 - Minutes of Meetings

The minutes of the Annual Meeting and any Special Meetings of the Association, together with such tabulated information as the clerk may deem useful, shall be published and distributed annually among the churches of the Association, the cost to be included in the Association's budget.

#### ARTICLE VII - Executive Board

### Section 1. Membership

The Executive Board shall be composed of the officers of the Association, pastors of member churches, and one representative from each member church, the same to be elected by the church of which the person is a member and to be certified to the Annual Meeting of the Association by means of the Annual Church Profile. In the event

a member is unable to complete a term, the church shall elect a replacement and notify the Association Office in writing. All department heads, chairpersons of all committees and Association staff directors shall be members. The Pastor of each Affiliated Church, and one member of his choosing, are encouraged to attend Executive Board meetings as guests and report the progress and/or needs of the church.

#### Section 2. Officers

The officers of the Association (see Article V) shall serve as the officers of the Executive Board.

### Section 3 - Powers

The Executive Board shall be the Association *ad interim*. The Executive Board shall transact the business of the Association between Meetings (Art. VI) and shall be authorized to fill any vacancies that may occur during the interim, upon recommendation from the Nominating Committee, the Personnel Advisory Committee, or a Director of Missions Search Committee. The Executive Board shall be further authorized to approve legal and financial affairs of the Association between Meetings of the Association.

### Section 4 – Meetings

The Executive Board shall meet once each quarter and/or at the call of the Moderator. The Moderator shall call special meetings of the Executive Board for urgent reason or upon request of a standing or special committee, provided (1) a notice of one week has been given, and (2) the purpose, time, and place of the meeting is stated in the notice.

## Section 5. Responsibilities of Executive Board Members

Executive Board members are expected to attend the meetings of the Board. Members shall convey to the Board the work, concerns, and needs of the churches they represent.

Members shall convey to the churches they represent the work, ministries, opportunities, needs and challenges of the Association.

Members with leadership responsibilities in the Association shall inform the Board of the status and/or needs of their ministries.

# Section 6 – Quorum

For the regularly scheduled quarterly meeting, those members of the Executive Board attending shall constitute a quorum. For a properly called meeting, Executive Board members from one-third (1/3) of the member churches of the Association shall constitute a quorum.

### **ARTICLE VIII – Committees, Councils, and Teams**

### Section 1. General Provisions.

- 1. Composition: Members of committees must be members of member churches. No two (2) persons from the same church shall serve on the same committee at the same time, except as serving by ex officio status. Any committee member who transfers church membership, resulting in an infringement of either of these provisions, shall vacate membership on the committee. The Moderator and Director of Missions shall serve as ex officio members of all committees, councils, and teams.
- **2. Nomination / Appointment:** All standing committees shall be nominated by the Nominating Committee, except the Nominating Committee which shall be appointed by the Moderator (see Section 2, 6.).
- **3. Term of Service:** Standing committees shall be nominated and elected on a rotating basis for a two (2) year term, with approximately one-half of the committee rotating off annually, unless otherwise specified for a specific committee (see Art. VIII, Section 2. 6. "Nominating Committee."). Members of committees scheduled to rotate off may continue to serve until their replacements are either appointed or elected.
- **4. Chair:** The Chair of all standing committees shall be nominated by the Nominating Committee from the senior class members, unless otherwise provided for that committee in these Bylaws.
- **5. Vacancies:** Vacancies on committees shall be filled by the Executive Board upon nomination by the Nominating Committee.

### Section 2. Standing Committees, Councils, and Teams

# 1. Associational Leadership / Missions Development Council

- **A. Composition:** This Council shall consist of the officers; directors/leaders of departments, ministries, and organizations; chairpersons of all standing committees; and Missions Ministries Director. The Director of Missions shall serve as chair. At a regular or duly called meeting, Council members present shall constitute a quorum.
- **B. Principal Function:** The Council shall coordinate, evaluate, and expand the life and work of the Association.

# C. Related Responsibilities:

- 1) Unify the missions efforts of various associational ministries;
- 2) Assist churches and mission churches applying for membership into the Association (see Art. IV. Sect. 4.);
- 3) Inform and recommend to the Association appropriate Christian response relating to issues of public morals, social justice, religious liberty and responsible, ethical conduct.
- 4) Recommend to the Finance Committee the goal for the annual Hanshew mission offering.
- 5) Recommend and expand improvements to the life and work of the Association.

### 2. Bylaws Committee

The Bylaws Committee shall consist of five (5) members. The primary duties of this committee shall be

- A. to study the Bylaws and propose amendments that it deems necessary;
- B. to advise and assist, as requested, in formulating proposed amendments;
- C. to insure that proposed amendments do not conflict with any existing provisions of the Bylaws; and,
- D. to report its review of any proposed amendment to the Executive Board and the Annual Session prior to the vote on the amendment (see Article XII, Amendments).

#### 3. **Finance Committee**

- **A. Composition:** The Finance Committee shall consist of six (6) members. The Vice-Moderator shall be the chair of the Committee. The Treasurer shall serve as ex officio member of the Committee.
- **B. Principal Function:** The Finance Committee shall provide general leadership to the entire associational financial and stewardship program.

### C. Responsibilities:

- 1) This Committee shall prepare and recommend to the Association at the Annual Meeting a budget for the ensuing fiscal year, provided the proposed budget has been previously reviewed and approved by the Executive Board.
- 2) This Committee shall meet as necessary, but not less than quarterly, to review the overall financial status of the Association and to conduct other necessary business.
- 3) The Committee shall present a printed report to the Executive Board quarterly and to the Association at the Annual Meeting.
- 4) This Committee shall encourage the churches to make regular and generous contributions to the associational work. It shall also confer with churches not contributing regularly to the Association.
- 4. Missions Development Council. (See Article VIII. 1. Associational Leadership / Missions Development Council.)

#### 5. New Work Team.

**A. Composition:** The New Work Team shall be composed of the Association's new work strategist, who shall serve as chair; the Finance Committee chair; and two (2) other members-at-large.

B. Principal Function: The New Work Team shall administer and implement the Association's new work strategy.

### C. Related Responsibilities:

- 1) Work with potential church planters/teams interested in the SRBA area to determine how well their vision aligns with the Association's new work strategy.
- 2) Assist church planters/teams in assessing potential locations for a church plant.
- 3) Recommend needed and merited financial assistance to the SRBA Finance Committee.
- 4) Report quarterly to the Executive Board the disposition and/or status of all inquiries and/or requests concerning new work received by the Team.

### 6. Nominating Committee

- A. The Nominating Committee shall be composed of six (6) members, appointed by the newly elected Moderator not later than December 1 following the Annual Meeting, to serve concurrently with the Moderator for a one (1) year term.
- B. At the April Executive Board meeting, the committee shall nominate leadership for departments, organizations, and standing committees, except those designated for appointment and those related to the WMU.
- C. At the Annual Meeting the committee shall nominate the officers for the Association, except the Director of Missions (see Art. V, Sect. 1).
- D. The committee shall nominate to the Executive Board replacements to fill vacancies that occur during the associational year.
- E. Whenever a vacancy occurs in the office of Director of Missions, the Nominating Committee shall nominate to the Executive Board a Director of Missions Search Committee per the provisions delineated in these Bylaws (see Art. VIII., Sect. 4).

## 7. Personnel Advisory Committee.

A. Composition and Principal Function: The Personnel Advisory Committee shall consist of six (6) members whose principal function shall be to assist the association in administrative matters pertaining to all employed personnel.

# B. Annual Responsibilities:

- (1) Prepare, review and update job descriptions and written personnel policies, and recommend needed changes to the Executive Board.
- (2) Administer job performance reviews and evaluations of staff members.
- (3) Consult with and recommend to the Finance Committee proposed budget items for Cash Compensation (salary/housing), Protection Benefits (retirement, insurance/Social Security offset), Expense Reimbursements (travel, conventions/conferences, discretionary), and other budget items pertaining to personnel.

#### C. Other Responsibilities:

- Review any special personnel issues referred to the committee and, when merited, report and/or recommend appropriate actions to the Executive Board.
- 2) Secure additional staff personnel, other than the Director of Missions, upon approval of the Executive Board.
- 3) The Chair of this committee shall serve on the Associational Leadership / Missions Development Council.

### 8. Program and Resolutions Committee

- A. The Program and Resolutions Committee shall be composed of four (4) members plus the Moderator and Vice-Moderator. This Committee shall plan and promote the program for the Annual Meeting. They shall recommend to the Association at the Annual Meeting the place of the next Annual Meeting, including the speaker and alternate.
- B. They shall draft, review, and present to the Annual Meeting or to the Executive Board resolutions of gratitude, other resolutions that it deems in order, or resolutions which may be received by referral.

### 9. Properties Committee.

The Properties Committee, consisting of four (4) members, shall have general oversight of association properties. The committee shall oversee the upkeep of and secure the effective maintenance of all buildings, vehicles, yards, building contents, equipment, and all other properties of the association. The committee shall make regular reports to the Executive Board regarding the condition of and the maintenance of all properties.

### **Section 3. Special Committees.**

- 1. All special committees, except the Director of Missions Search Committee, shall be established upon approval by the Executive Board and appointed by the Moderator.
  - 2. Special committees shall be dissolved upon completion of their assignment.

#### Section 4. Director of Missions Search Committee.

- 1. Whenever a vacancy occurs in the office of Director of Missions, a Director of Missions Search Committee shall be established according to the following provisions:
- 2. The Nominating Committee shall nominate to the Executive Board <u>six (6)</u> members, representing a cross section of the Association, to serve as the Director of Missions Search Committee.
- 3. The recommendation of the Search Committee shall be presented to the Executive Board at a regular or special meeting, with due notice having been given. A two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members present and voting shall constitute a call to the prospective Director of Missions.
- 4. After assisting the newly called Director of Missions to relocate into the area, the Search Committee shall be dissolved.

### **ARTICLE IX – Departments, Ministries, and Organizations**

**Section 1.** Departments, ministries and organizations shall be organized to inform, encourage, train, and equip constituent churches in the following general areas, and others as may be needed:

- Bible teaching
- discipleship
- evangelism
- leadership development missions organizations
- stewardship
- worship

**Section 2.** Organizational structure and leadership titles may be modified by the Associational Leadership Council as the need arises.

**Section 3.** Position descriptions for volunteer leaders shall be formulated by the Director of Missions and approved by the Associational Leadership Council.

**Section 4.** Leaders for the departments, ministries and organizations shall be nominated by the Nominating Committee and elected by the Executive Board, unless otherwise specifically provided in these Bylaws.

#### ARTICLE X – Handbooks and Manuals

Section 1. Handbooks and/or policies and procedures manuals may be produced for the Association provided the handbook or manual has been approved by the Executive Board following at least a thirty (30) day review.

**Section 2.** Any handbook or manual may be amended by a majority of the Executive Board present and voting at any regular or special meeting provided a ten (10) day written notice of the proposed amendment has been given. Without due notice, proposed amendments must receive a two-thirds (2/3) approval of those Board members present and voting.

### **ARTICLE XI – Parliamentary Guide**

The latest edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall serve as a guide for conducting business in this Association.

#### **ARTICLE XII – Amendments**

These bylaws may be amended at any Annual Meeting by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the messengers present and voting, provided:

- written notice of the proposed amendment has been given to a regularly scheduled meeting of the Executive Board;
- the proposed amendment has been subsequently referred to and reviewed by the Bylaws Committee; and,
- the proposed amendment has been read to the Executive Board at the meeting last preceding the Annual Meeting.
